### January 26, 2009 Annual meeting:

Our annual Amberlea Homeowners' Association meeting at the Dunedin Community Center was attended by approximately 26 people. President David Dunlap introduced our city liaison, Dunedin City Commissioner Julie Scales. With her was City Engineer, Tom Burke who has been working with the FDOT regarding traffic control changes to the SR580 & Sunlight intersection at our subdivision entrance. FDOT has deemed our intersection not worthy of a left hand turn signal light, but is creating left hand and straight lanes for east and south/west bound traffic respectively. This will require the narrowing of the center island, adding a bicycle lane on the western side of Sunlight; and, replacing our entrance signage more northerly on the island. The city will participate with the funding and construction of new signage and we are expecting a timely completion of this project beginning in 2009. Until this project is completed, the Amberlea Board will postpone additional landscaping and irrigation improvements to our entranceway.

The featured speaker was Fire Marshall Bill McElligott. His informative address of fire prevention in the home was well received. If you do not have adequate smoke detectors in your home, the Fire Department will assist you in making wise choices.
